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EDELSTEIN, District Judge:

WHEREAS on March 14, 1989, plaintiffs United States of America, ("the Government") and defendants the International Brotherhood of Teamsters ("the IBT") and others entered into a Consent Decree. Among other things, the Consent Decree empowered Court-appointed officers to investigate and file charges against members of the IBT; and

WHEREAS on October 12, 1989, Anthony Hughes and William Friedman moved this Court for an injunction pursuant to Rule 65 seeking to enjoin the Independent Administrator from conducting hearings on charges filed against them by the Investigations Officer under the Consent Decree; and

WHEREAS on October 16, 1989, this Court held oral argument on Friedman and Hughes' motion; and

WHEREAS this Court now orders that further briefs be submitted, specifically addressing (1) the standing of Friedman and Hughes to move for this injunction; (2) the ripeness of the subject of the injunction; (3) what irreparable harm, if any, Friedman and Hughes will suffer as a result of the hearing by the Independent Administrator; and

WHEREAS this Court directs that attorneys for Friedman and Hughes shall appoint local counsel pursuant to local rule 2(c) and 3(a); and

WHEREAS this Court further orders that movants Friedman and Hughes submit their papers by hand, before 12:00 p.m. on October 23, 1989; and that responsive papers from the Government and the Independent Administrator be filed by hand before 12:00 p.m. on October 26, 1989, with courtesy copies to chambers for all submissions.
